Pentecostalism

With Pentecost around the corner, I thought I would write

about the renewal movement of Pentecostalism. Pentecostal churches place special emphasis on a direct personal experience of God. The name comes directly from the word "Pentecost" which in the Christian calendar is the day when the Holy Spirit descended on apostles. Like other forms of evangelical Protestantism, Pentecostalism adheres to the belief in the Bible as truth and the necessity of accepting Jesus Christ as personal Lord and Savior. A primary teaching is the belief that baptism of the Holy Spirit enables a Christian to live a Spirit-filled and empowered life. It also embraces the practices of speaking in tongues and divine healing. This movement spread throughout the United States in the early 20th century after the three-year-long Azusa Street Revival in Los Angeles, CA. The Revival started in April 1906 by William Seymour an African American preacher who preached on the importance of receiving the Holy Spirit. Comprising over 700 denominations and a large number of independent churches, there is no central authority governing Pentecostalism although many churches are associated with the Pentecostal World Fellowship. There are over 279 million Pentecostals worldwide.
